A 2015 paper describes a set of competencies that will be taught to practitioners in a 45-hour online curriculum produced by the National Center for Integrative Primary Healthcare, to be used in primary care training programs.¹

A 2015 systematic review states that Doctors of Chiropractic successfully collaborate with other providers in veteran and military health care settings to manage patients with complex health care needs.²
