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President's Report

This year marked meaningful progress on the mission of Clinical Compass: improving patient outcomes by advancing evidence-based care. We amplified our research pipeline, expanded student and faculty access to the Evidence Center, strengthened partnerships with national stakeholders, and modernized our internal operations to support sustainable growth.

Research and guidelines. We moved several high-impact projects forward. Our clinical practice guideline on chiropractic management of adults with cervicogenic and tension-type headache was submitted for publication. A systematic review on non-operative management of common shoulder conditions is underway. Companion reviews on older adults advanced in journal review, including an updated synthesis of adverse events following chiropractic care and a review of the efficacy of spinal manipulation for spine pain in older adults. We also advanced a consensus effort to define evidence-synthesis priorities that will guide the next several years of work. In parallel, we initiated CITADEL, a patient-safety guideline collaboration aligned with the WFC Global Patient Safety Initiative, to build shared language and learning systems for safety across settings.



Leadership and administration. Under Dr. Clint Daniels, the Scientific Commission delivered tangible step-ups in pace and rigor this year: tighter project management, clearer editorial standards, and proactive rapid-response work that is raising the quality bar across our portfolio. *Chiropractic and Manual Therapies* named our cost-effectiveness systematic review its 2024 Paper of the Year, and Dr. Ron Farabaugh actively promoted its findings across the profession, engaging state associations, payers, and policy stakeholders to translate evidence into practice and coverage conversations. On the operations side, we transitioned administrative support, welcoming Suzi Anderson with ChiroCongress as our new administrator and offering sincere thanks to Janet Jordan for nearly two decades of dedicated service; her steady leadership has been instrumental in advancing Clinical Compass.

Evidence Center access and NBCE collaboration. Our collaboration with the National Board of Chiropractic Examiners (NBCE) entered its first year with a shared focus on reaching chiropractic universities. We expanded complimentary Evidence Center access for students, faculty, and recent graduates, deployed institution-specific access codes, and began building a faculty toolkit with slide decks, classroom activities, and navigation guides that make course integration simple. The Evidence Center remains the hub for concise, high-value summaries across seventeen topic areas, refreshed twice per year with one-page updates for rapid translation. We submitted our FY2026 proposal to sustain access, complete the toolkit and related resources, and meet 2026 penetration goals across campuses, and we look forward to the possibility of continued NBCE support.

Partnerships and outreach. We are grateful to the NCMIC Foundation for renewing support this year. The second round of funding helps sustain Evidence Center updates, knowledge translation, and outreach to state associations. Our Speakers Bureau is still in the building phase, yet we delivered education at multiple conferences and continued rapid-response support to states and partners on coverage and safety topics. These engagements advance shared goals of safety, effectiveness, and responsible integration with the broader health system.

Thank you to our Executive Committee, Scientific Commission, ChiroCongress representatives, donors, and partners for another productive year. Your time, insight, and resources are the reason we can produce trustworthy evidence, make it easy to use, and stand beside the profession as we translate it into better care. Clinical Compass is well positioned for the next phase, with priorities to complete current reviews and guidelines, broaden engagement with university students and faculty, and promote best practices that enhance patient care.

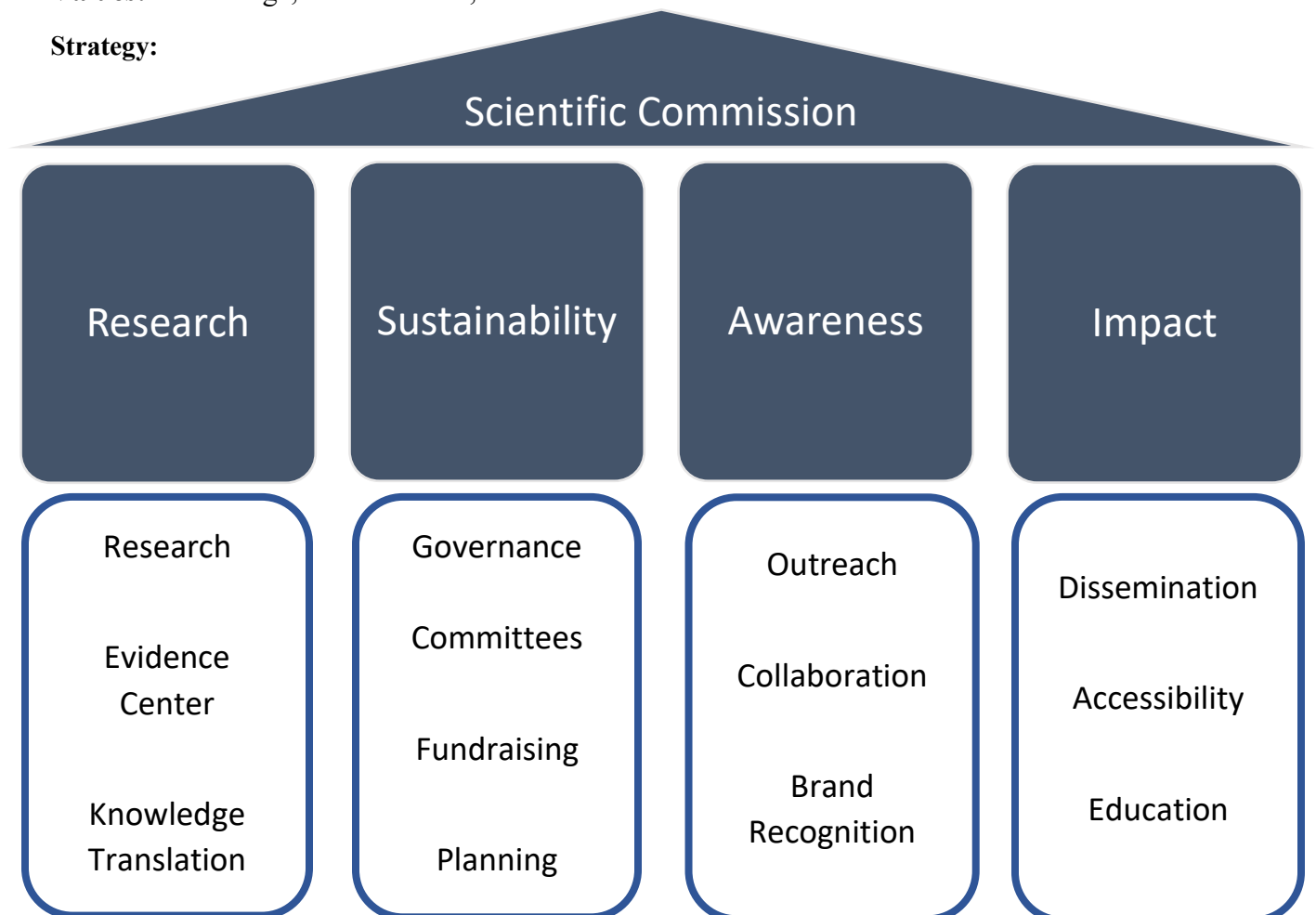
Originally known as Council on Chiropractic Guidelines and Practice Parameters (CCGPP), Clinical Compass was formed in 1995 through efforts of ChiroCongress (formerly Congress of Chiropractic State Associations) as a pathway to equip the profession with evidence to engage in discussions with payers, legislators, and other stakeholders on matters relevant to chiropractic. To date, literature generated by Clinical Compass has primarily been utilized by national and state chiropractic associations for practicing chiropractors. Clinical Compass is an established leader in the chiropractic scientific community and is dedicated to supporting the profession through adherence and reliance on evidence and interprofessional collaboration. 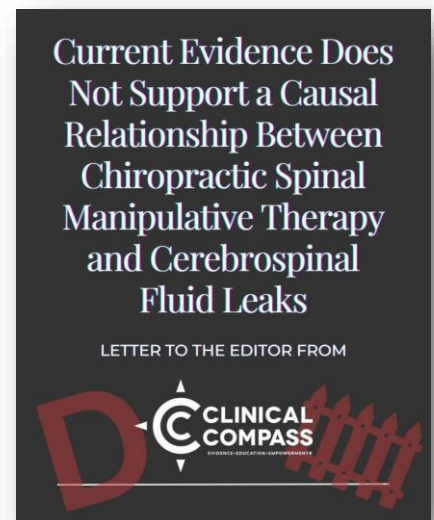

In 2025, Clinical Compass continued to grow its media footprint with focused efforts on two platforms: LinkedIn and Facebook. With this messaging, we target chiropractic clinicians, students, academicians, and researchers. Since the 2024 annual report, our LinkedIn followers have grown by **33%** to 942 and our Facebook followers have grown by **7%** to 1,114. 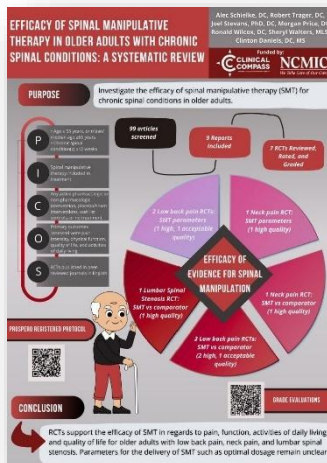
